Entries shall be on an individual basis and must be produced by the exhibitor. Only one entry per individual is permitted and an entry shall consist of four grades: Flyings, Lugs, Bright Leaf and Red Leaf. Each grade shall consist of two hands of 20 leaves each and samples entered in Classes 5 through 8 shall not be considered for this class.

LOT -17 YOUTH HORTICULTURE

- A. Exhibits will be judged on the quality of the primary (horticulture) project work.
- B. All plants exhibited MUST have been grown by the 4-H'er
- C. Plants are entered at risk of exhibitor.
- D. Vegetables entered should be fresh, with the label on top of exhibit. Do not stick toothpicks in produce.
- E. Do not use garden soil in containers. Use well drained disease free potting soil for all containers.
- F. OPTIONAL: Fruits and Vegetables may be picked up at 10:00 am, Wednesday, June 24, 2015

PLANT DISPLAY

- 4-H 565 - Terrariums
- 4-H 566 - Dish gardens (desert or tropical)
- 4-H 567 - Vegetable bucket gardens (grown in container - not dug out of the garden)
- 4-H 568 - Annual bucket gardens
- 4-H 569 - House plants
- 4-H 570 - Hanging baskets
- 4-H 571 - Herb Container Garden
- 4-H 572 - Window Box Display
- 4-H 573 - Upcycle Container Garden

GARDEN AND/OR ORCHARD DISPLAYS

4-H-574 - The exhibitor may exhibit as many different fruits and/or vegetables from their garden as desired Any size or type (minimum of five types) of produce may be displayed. The exhibit must be in a display container (box or basket) which can easily be moved.

The vegetables will be judged as follows:

Quality of Produce 40%
Attractiveness of Container 30%
Uniformity and True-To-Typeness 10%
Number of Different Types 15%
Labeling 5%

4-Her's may also exhibit plates of vegetables.

Classes of vegetables will be limited to the following:

- 4-H 575 - Tomato (5 per plate) Must be ripe (red or yellow) Cherry Type
- 4-H 576 - Tomato (5 per plate), beef Steak
- 4-H 577 - Tomato (5 per plate) Heirloom
- 4-H 578 - Peppers - Hot (5 per plate)
- 4-H 579 - Peppers - Bell (5 per plate)
- 4-H 580 - Peppers - Sweet (5 per plate)
- 4-H 581 - Cucumbers, slicing (5 per plate)
- 4-H 582 - Cucumbers -pickling (5 per plate)
- 4-H 583 - Beans, Snap or Lima (12 per plate)
- 4-H 584 - Corn, Sweet (in the husk with silk, 5 ears per plate)
- 4-H 585 - Cantaloupe (1 whole, halved)
- 4-H 586 Squash, summer (3 per plate)
- 4-H 587 Eggplant (3 per plant)
- 4-H 588 Potato (5 per plate)

The vegetable will be judged as follows:

Condition 25%
Quality 20%
Uniformity 20%
True-to-Type 20%
Size 15%

The largest vegetable may not be the highest *quality*; nevertheless, it is unique. The largest entry in each of the following classes will receive a class champion ribbon.
